
Among the Crabs, A Shy Masked Lady*

Key Concepts

- 1. Some animals, such as Decorator crabs, camouflage themselves by affixing other animals and plants to their exteriors.
- 2. Different crabs have various ways of eating, moving and protecting themselves.



Teaching Hints

Read chapter 14 of *Pagoo* with students. Have them make additions to their Pagoo Field Guides.

Chapter Summary

Pagoo molts again. His large, right claw is now big enough to be a good "door"; but, it is not as effective as an operculum, the horny shield on a snail's foot used to seal the snail shell's opening. Pagoo observes a Decorator crab molt and, then, redecorate her new home.

Key Words
