

INTRODUCTION

"We Care About Oceans" is a slide show emphasizing the theme of the 1981 observance of National Wildlife Week, an annual event sponsored by the National Wildlife Federation. The show complements other educational materials produced by the Federation for Wildlife Week. However, this slide program can also stand alone, and its life span is potentially indefinite, rather than just the period from one annual Wildlife Week to the next.

This Guide is divided into two sections. Part I consists of the narration for each of the slides.

Part II contains additional information on topics introduced by various slides. The purpose of Part II is to explain the slide subject matter in greater depth and help kindle viewer interest in the marine environment. Teachers may use the information to develop the subjects of particular slides more fully in order to give special emphasis where desired. Part II also contains a list of suggested class activities, a glossary of marine terms, and a list of references, including marine curriculum materials.

Presenting the Slide Program

The labeled side of the accompanying cassette contains the spoken narration for the slides. Beep-type signals have been inserted to tell you when to change slides. To begin the program, put the first slide (the title slide) on the screen and start the cassette. When you hear the first signal, advance the projector to Slide 2 (sunrise on the beach), and from there on through the entire program.

The other side of the cassette is the same narration with an inaudible tone (1000Hz System) that will advance each slide automatically when used with an automatic projector. To begin the show, put the first slide on the screen and start the cassette. The program will then continue through all the slides automatically.
