

Be Kind to Seal Rock Campground...

Over 34,000 people use Seal Rock Campground each year. If we're not aware of what we do when we're there, we could do its natural world harm. Here are some "manners" to discuss with your students before their visit.

- Respect all living things.
- Watch where you step.
 - avoid stepping on living things.
 - avoid slippery rocks and logs.
- Obey regulations concerning the collection of any natural materials.
- Collect only photos, rubbings, written records, and memories.
- Stay on trails, whether marked by signs or not.
- Put all garbage you find in trash cans.
- Pick up rocks rather than rolling them. In this way, creatures underneath will not be smashed accidentally.
- Replace all rocks exactly as you found them. Many animals need the shady, moist protection of the underside and would die without it.
- Leave creatures attached to rocks on the rocks.
- Leave all oyster shells on the same beach where they were found and at the same tidal height.
- Fill in any holes you dig.
- Follow the three "L's":

Look, Learn and Leave alone.
